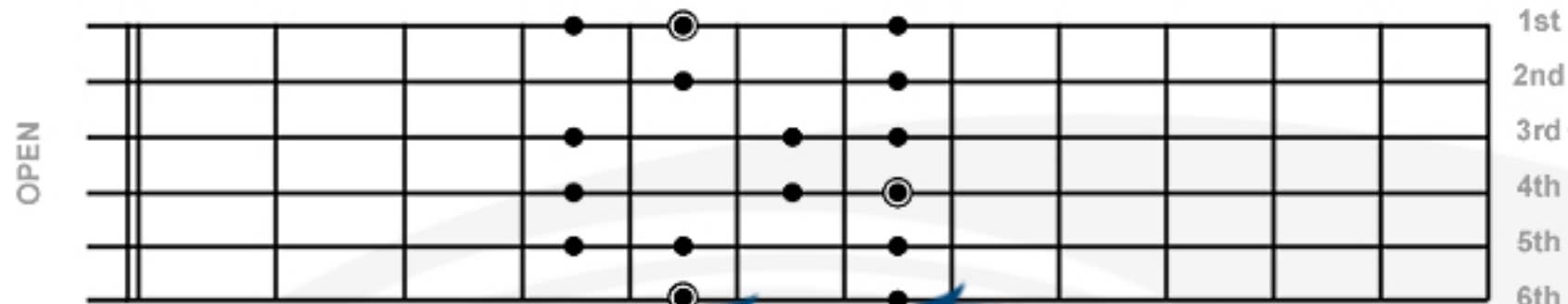


# Scale chart helper

● = Tonic

Major Scale Pattern #4



**1** This is the name of the scale with the corresponding pattern number.

**2** These are string number indicators, the 1<sup>st</sup> string is the skinniest string on your guitar and the 6<sup>th</sup> is the thickest.

**3** These solid dots represent a fretted string. You fret a string using your fingers.

**4** These solid dots with a circle around them represent the tonic of the scale, in this example the tonic is the note A.

**5** This is the staff with the scale pattern represented in musical notation.

A Major Scale Pattern #4

**8** This is the key signature that the scale is in, in this example the key is A major.

**7** The circled number represents the tonic of the scale, in this example the tonic is the note A.

**6** This is guitar tabalture with the scale pattern represented by string and fret numbers.
